- A tour of the District Six and Robben Island Museums
- Excursions to <u>Inverdoorn Game Reserve</u>, <u>Cape Peninsula</u>, <u>Kirstenbosch National</u> <u>Botanical Gardens</u> and a hike to the top of <u>Table Mountain</u>
- An overnight stay at <u>Kopanong Bed & Breakfast</u> in Khayelitsha Township, Cape Town's largest township

#### **Timing & Travel**

Participants will make their own arrangements for air travel, departing on Saturday, July 22, for arrival to the Cape Town International Airport on Sunday, July 23. All participants will depart Cape Town on Sunday, July 30.

We will share Dean Leloudis's travel itinerary upon confirmation of your participation in case you wish to travel with him.

## **Cost & Registration**

Thanks to generous support from Honors Carolina alumni, we can offer this Cape Town adventure for a deeply discounted price of \$1,850, which covers the cost of lodging, airport transfers, museum tickets, excursions, health insurance, and three meals per day. Airfare is not included in the program fee.

Students interested in participating should <u>sign up here</u>. In order for us to confirm your participation, we'll need to verify that you have:

formally accepted your Honors Carolina invitation

• formally accepted admission to UNC and paid your enrollment deposit

Once confirmed, you will receive a follow-up email regarding payment procedures, passport requirements, and flight arrangements. Program participants will be billed via their UNC student account for the total \$1,850 program fee. A \$300 non-refundable deposit is due within two weeks of billing. The full balance is due by May 15.

Once 15 students have been confirmed, additional applicants will be wait listed.
